

CDR Ronald Bolt September 1933 – November 2011

Ron Bolt passed away after a short illness at Renown Hospital, Reno, NV on Nov. 18, 2011. He is survived by his wife Patricia, they were married in 1955. He is also survived by his brother Richard Bolt and many Aunts, Uncles, Nieces and Nephews.

His Navy career began at age 17, when he enlisted. He became interested in aviation, entered the NAVCAD program, was commissioned and won his Navy Wings. He served in VA-25 during the Fist's '67-'68 combat deployment embarked in Coral Sea. Among numerous successful RESCAPS, he was also involved in the Lang Vei operation. Ron was a life member of the FOFA and was a generous contributor to the Fist Education Grant, having contributed a total of \$2,100 to the fund.

After 30 years of flying all over the world, from Antarctica to the South Pacific in Duty Stations too numerous to mention he retired and decided to try Corporate flying. Ron enjoyed his life as a Navy pilot and was very proud of his achievements and of his many medals and awards. CDR Bolt was recently awarded a Silver Star of Valor and Gallantry on a mission he flew in Viet Nam.
